General Information about the Fresh Start Program:

- Students eligible for the Fresh Start initiative will temporarily regain eligibility to the federal student aid programs: Pell Grant, Federal SEOG, Federal Work-Study, and Federal Direct Loans.
- Students eligible for the Fresh Start initiative must have a complete financial aid file in order to be offered federal student aid. Students who are ineligible for any other reason (e.g., failing to meet satisfactory academic progress standards, owing an overpayment on a Title IV grant or being in default on another ineligible loan) are not eligible to receive Title IV aid unless the eligibility issue is resolved.
- This is not loan forgiveness, meaning your loan debt balance is not being reduced or cancelled. All Fresh
 Start initiative participants must repay their loans and will have one year after the end of the COVID-19
 student loan payment pause to make payment arrangements. Any borrower with eligible defaulted
 federal student loans can make payment arrangements during the initiative by visiting
 myeddebt.ed.gov, contacting their loan holder by phone or in writing, or calling the Default Resolution
 Group at 1-800-621-3115.
