



INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIP APPEAL FORM

The deadline to submit an institutional scholarship appeal for the 2026-2027 academic year is Friday, May 15, 2026.

The Scholarship Oversight Committee reviews appeals the first Wednesday of each month. Your completed appeal form and packet will be reviewed by the Scholarship Oversight Committee for additional consideration of institutional scholarships ONLY. You must document your special or mitigating circumstances. The circumstances will be considered ONLY once. (Example: medical circumstances must be submitted with documentation from your medical provider.)

If requested documentation is not attached, the appeal form will be marked incomplete and will not be reviewed. Applicants will be notified via their Shelton State student email account. Information will not be provided by phone. Scholarship appeals may be filed for the following institutional scholarships only: Academic, Ambassador, Collegiate 100, Fine Arts, R.E.A.C.H, Shelton Sophomore Summer Studies, Shelton Summer Studies, and Technical.

- Typed essay detailing special or mitigating circumstances
- Copy of current schedule and cumulative transcript
